Results to date:

Increase in X-waivered Physicians:

Net increase over the period of the grant: 4 physicians

Major Milestones and Progress

1. YTD we have spent \$315,000 or 100% of grantee funds.
2. Unduplicated Goals are as follows:
 - 220 screening goal; completed 369(8 Pending) or 172% of target goal
 - 80 assessments goal; completed 130 or 162% of target goal
 - 52 OUD linkages, completed 97 or 176% of target goal
 - 24 OUD youth projected in MAT; treated 17 in MAT or 70% of target goal

Prevention Events

- 133 Caretakers, 103 students, 83 members of community agencies (319 Total)
- Narcan distribution to 92 individuals
- 395 reached for professional and/or stakeholder training
- 12 x-waivered pediatricians trained
- 5 Webinars
- 1 community stakeholder meeting



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Marketing Efforts

Practitioners, Emergency Department Personnel and AOD Providers :

Reviewed national and local data and conducted a literature review on youth opioid use, facilitators and barriers to accessing treatment and best practices

Gathered and analyzed data via an online survey from 43 local practitioners

Met with providers from local Prescribe Safe Initiative

Added MAT, Professional Referral and other Youth AOD services to Door to Hope's website

Added Door to Hope to SAMSHA's treatment locator

Created and disseminated provider marketing materials: MAT brochure, Folder and Poster

Held a Stakeholder Event March 6th, 2020 with a total of 38 attendees

Established Door to Hope as local media spokesperson on the opioid crisis

Law Enforcement and Probation Officers :

Met with police chiefs from Gonzales, Soledad, Greenfield and King City

Met with social services, probation and juvenile hall

Created and disseminated pocket cards with Door to Hope and local resources

Provided a webinar on June 17th to 49 probation officers on youth opioid use disorder and local resources

Parents, Loved Ones and Youth :

Created, implemented and analyzed 1 English and 2 Spanish parent focus groups and 1 English

youth focus group reaching a total of 31 participants

Provided English and Spanish parent webinars on April 30th and July 8th on youth opioid use disorder and local resources with a total of 77 participants

Created and analyzed English and Spanish parent webinar pre and post surveys
