

Adolescent and Young Adult Treatment Resources (5-1-14)

The Institute of Medicine (2006. [Improving the Quality of Health Care for Mental and Substance-Use Conditions, Quality Chasm Series](#), Washington, DC: National Academies Press) identified many barriers in current care and recommended the increase use of standardized and evidenced based screening, assessment and treatment protocols. This page provides a link to some of the more widely used resources developed and/or used by SAMHSA/CSAT's adolescent and young adult treatment grantees that may be of use to current and future grantees as well as others in the field in general. It is organized into reviews and protocols for each of these 3 areas, followed by a more general review of topic areas identified by NIDA (2014) principles of adolescent substance use disorder treatment. Each area begins with a recent published review and then is followed by one or more articles on protocols/resources that have been used. Where possible we have also included links to the purveyors of specific protocols and/or other sites for more information.
