The Santa Clara Model

TREATMENT COURT

- First treatment court for Substance Abuse was started in 1992
- First Judge to embrace was Judge Manley
- Develop integrated court assessment team

INTEGRATED ASSESSMENT TEAM

- Clinical staff were placed in the court working with the Judge, Probation and other CJS system members
- Team provide an assessment of the substance history and presenting problems of the defendant
- Team recommended the appropriate initial level of care
- This was not based on community safety but rather clinical presentation and alignment with ASAM Placement Criteria

REFERRAL TO TREATMENT

- From Court defendants are provide either a residential bed or a outpatient treatment slots
- The Bed/Slot is held open until the defendant is discharged from jail
- For defendants in jail pending release a toll free phone number is utilized from the Jail setting to call the GATEWAY(Screening and Assessment) call center for review and placement in the appropriate level of care.
- A residential bed or outpatient slot is then held open for the defendant upon release from jail
- Typically it take 5-7 days for discharge to happen

COMMUNICATIONS BACK TO COURT/CJS

- The treating facility provides a Treatment Status Report monthly to the reporting authority.

- Provides Treatment Status
 - Urinalysis
 - Attendance
 - Treatment Progress
 - Change or modification of treatment goals
 - Transfer to higher or lower level of care
 - Discharge Status
 - Comments

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT VERSUS OUTPATIENT

- ASAM definition of Residential Care “Imminent Danger”
- With ODS Waiver-limit of two episodes annually
- Average Length of Stay for Residential-30 days
 - 70% of discharges from Residential are placed in Outpatient Treatment
 - The delivery system allows for immediate upgrade or downgrade in treatment intensity without having to return to Court
- Outpatient treatment includes intensive Targeted Case Management Services
